Famous win for St. Benedict's in BT Faul Final.

St Benedict's, Randalstown 0-10 Our Lady's, Castleblaney 1-5

St. Benedict's, Randalstown overturned a comprehensive defeat in their opening league game with Our Lady's Castleblaney to claim their first ever Ulster Colleges' title in Pomeroy.

A good start is often half the battle and the St. Benedict's Randalstown side took advantage of the breeze to shoot seven unanswered points in the opening half, corner-forward Martin Johnston finding the target four times from frees. The highlights of a very entertaining half of football were the strong defensive play by the winners and a spectacular point from Aidan Swann.

With captain Donagh McKeever continuing to dominate at centre-half back, St Benedict's added two more points in the opening ten minutes of the second half from Christy Sheerin and Jamie Kennedy before the Monaghan boys found their feet through the efforts of Fergal Mulligan and Padhraic Graham.

Graham hit three of their points in the last twenty minutes, but a well taken point from Aaron Coleman put the Randalstown school well in control. A goal for Castleblaney from Mulligan who had moved up from defence came in the fourth minute of extra time – too late to halt the Antrim side's celebrations.

On the day, St Benedict's were well served by corner backs Niall Devlin and Michael T. Carey and an inspirational performance by team captain Donagh McKeever. Midfielders Matthew Fitzgerald and Malachy Duffin covered every blade of grass and were ably assisted by some stunning high-fielding from Martin Johnston. Up front the Kennedy brothers, Enda and Jamie, won vital balls and full forward Christy Sheerin continuously tormented his markers.

Year 8 Trip To Woodhall

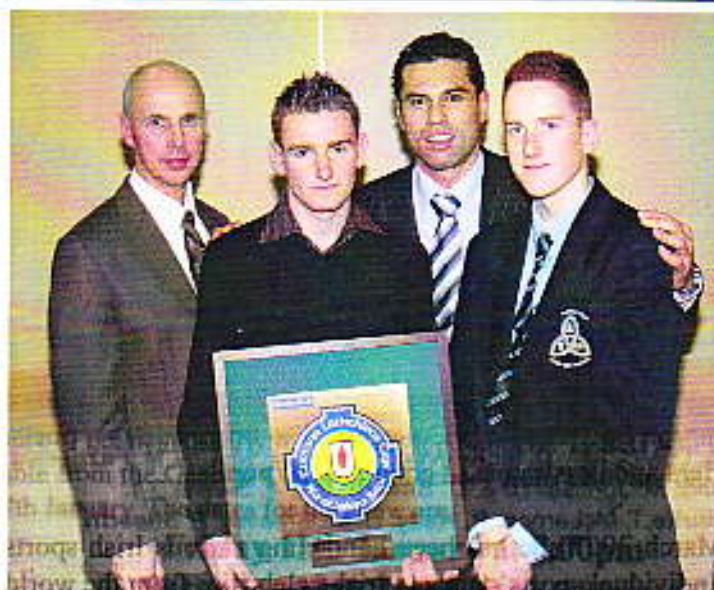
